# Immigrant Rights Advocates Urge Court to Block Latest "Public Charge" Rules

(New York, NY) – On **Friday, February 28, 2020, at 11:00 a.m.**, immigrant rights advocates will **argue in federal court** for a **preliminary injunction blocking three interrelated "public charge" rules** from going into effect. Two of the rules issued by the U.S. Department of State apply to immigrants who must undergo consular processing outside of the country, and redefine the term "public charge" to deny lawful permanent residence to anyone they believe to be likely to use any amount of certain cash and non-cash benefits at any time in the future. A related presidential proclamation, also to be implemented by consular officers, bars entry to immigrants who cannot demonstrate an ability to obtain "acceptable" forms of health insurance within 30 days of arrival or the financial resources to pay for any foreseeable medical costs. <u>Make the Road New York v. Pompeo</u> is the first federal lawsuit seeking to block all three related actions.

A separate case, <u>Make the Road New York v. Cuccinelli</u>, seeks to permanently enjoin a nearly identical rule promulgated by the Department of Homeland Security. An appeal of a preliminary injunction currently blocking that rule will be <u>heard in the Second Circuit Court of Appeals on Monday</u>.
