

How to Get Your Birth Certificate

Step 1: Identify Where You Were Born

- NYC (all five boroughs): https://www.nyc.gov/site/doh/services/birth-death-records-birth.page (managed by NYC Health Department Department of Vital Records)
- NYS outside NYC: https://www.health.ny.gov/vital_records/birth.htm (managed by New York State Department of Health)
- Puerto Rico: https://portal.311.nyc.gov/article/?kanumber=KA-01022
- Other State or Territory: https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/w2w/ index.htm
- Country outside of the U.S.: https://portal.311.nyc.gov/article/?kanumber=KA-01023
- * If you were born in New York City, you can follow the instructions below.

Step 2: Decide on the type of birth certificate you would like

There are two types of birth certificates (the application is the same for both):

- Short Form: The short form is the most requested certificate. It can be used for most domestic purposes.
- Long Form: The long form includes additional information and is generally used for international purposes, such as dual citizenship, international adoption, international marriage, time of birth, and apostille certificates (https://www.usa.gov/authenticate-us-document).

Step 3: Gather Required Documents

 Within 120 days (about 4 months) from your prison release date, you can apply for a birth certificate with your NYS DOCCS Released Offender Identification Card and release papers.



- Otherwise, it is best to refer to the NYC Health Department website for the necessary documents: <a href="https://www.nyc.gov/site/doh/services/birth-death-records-ordering-ordering-ord
 - → You need EITHER one document from Category 1 (copy is fine) OR two documents from Category 2 (originals). You do not need both.
 - → If you do not have documents from either category, you can email nycdohvr@health.nyc.gov for assistance.
 - → If you are a U.S. veteran seeking a free birth certificate, you will also need to provide proof of your veteran status.



Step 4: Complete the Application

^{*}If you are a U.S. veteran, you may be entitled to receive a free birth certificate if your request is related to one of the following reasons:

- 1. Benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs
- 2. Enlistment or induction in the U.S. armed forces
- 3. An application for a veteran's bonus pursuant to any NYS law
- Applications for allowances for dependents of U.S. armed forces personnel

You will need to provide any one of the following proofs of veteran status: https://www.nyc.gov/site/doh/services/birth-death-records-ordering.page#doc

Step 5: Receive Your Birth Certificate

- You will receive a copy of your Birth Certificate in the mail.
- You cannot receive it at a c/o (care of) address.
