How to Get a Public Library Card

With a public library card, you can borrow books, music, and movies, but you can also access lots of other services the NYC public libraries offer, including continuing education classes, language lessons, career skills workshops, computer and printing services, and Culture Pass (free access to certain museums and cultural institutions). The libraries also offer services specifically for formerly incarcerated individuals.

Anyone who lives, works, attends school, or owns property in NYC is eligible for a public library card.

There are three public library systems within NYC: New York Public Library (Manhattan, Bronx, and Staten Island); Queens Public Library; and Brooklyn Public Library. Each requires its own library card, but you can have more than one library card if you would like.

To get full access to the library's services, you will need identification and proof of address (shelters accepted). If you do not have those, you can still get a library card with more limited benefits.
