Vote In NYC Jails Coalition and Elected Officials to Rally Outside NYC Board of Elections to Demand Polling Sites, Equal Ballot Access for Incarcerated New Yorkers

(NEW YORK, NY) — The Vote in NYC Jails Coalition, along with New York City Public Advocate Jumaane D. Williams, Councilmember Gale Brewer, The Legal Aid Society, LatinoJustice PRLDEF, the League of Women Voters of the City of New York, the NYC Chapter National Action Network Second Chance Committee, and others, will rally on Election Day outside the New York City Board of Elections (BOE) to demand that the BOE and the Department of Correction ensure every eligible voter incarcerated in NYC jails can cast a ballot that is counted.

The Coalition is calling for the establishment of polling sites in city jails, citing the BOE's repeated rejection of registration forms and absentee ballots from eligible voters at Rikers Island, where 6,000 people — 92 percent of whom are people of color — are potentially eligible to vote. The current absentee system has consistently failed to deliver equal access to the ballot, effectively disenfranchising thousands of Black and Brown New Yorkers each year.
